Milwaukee, Wisconsin. March 3, 2016 - The Milwaukee Hub of the World Economic Forum's Global Shapers community is pleased to announce that Carmen Northwest High School sophomore Alvin Watts has been selected to participate in a Group of Seven ("G7") Youth Summit in Hiroshima, Japan. This trip is in conjunction with Shape Asia Pacific 2016, a meeting which convenes all Global Shapers from hubs in Asia Pacific. The Youth Summit will focus on international peace and take place from March 18 - March 21. All expenses are paid by the Global Shapers in Japan and their local sponsors.

24 high school students were selected for the summit, 12 from Japan and 12 from G7 countries to engage in conversations around international peace—Alvin was one of only two selected from the United States. During the summit, participants will be able to touch on the reality of the atomic bombing. Alvin will visit the Peace Memorial Museum, offer flowers at the Cenotaph for the atomic bomb victims, and listen to accounts by atomic bomb survivors. Participants will also draft a "Hiroshima Declaration" after discussing what young people can do to help realize a more peaceful world. At the end of the summit, participants will visit the island of Miyajima, in Hiroshima, for further cultural experiences.

"When I was young, my father passed away while reconstructing our home. I carry with me his dream to travel overseas. A kid from Milwaukee going halfway across the world sounds crazy, but it's happening to me! I'm thankful for the opportunity to have one of my dreams become a reality. This is going to change my outlook on the world and inspire me to see the rest of it." - Alvin Watts

Maurice Thomas, Vice Curator of the Milwaukee Global Shapers Hub was a part of the nomination and selection process that choose Alvin, and will be participating as his chaperone throughout the duration of the trip. While in Japan, Mr. Thomas will also participate in Shape Asia Pacific 2016, to share the challenges and opportunities for peace in Milwaukee with Global Shapers from around the world. Mr. Thomas is the Founder & Executive Director of Milwaukee Excellence Charter School.

When the opportunity was presented that two students from the United States would be selected as part of the delegation, I did everything to make sure a student from Milwaukee was selected.
